THE MARKET STILL LOOKS GOOD

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- Single-family home sales have grown by 12%. This was all on Sanibel with Captiva showing a modest decline. Homes fronting on the gulf or bay have turned around and showed almost 30% growth. All other homes are in positive territory but at a lower level.
- Condominium sales were modestly up 3% but showed a difference on the two islands.
 Sanibel sales were down 4% while Captiva sales were up almost 60%. One and three bedroom units were up 16% while two bedroom units were down 6%.
- Vacant land continues to show large gains.
- Average sale prices for both homes and condominiums are on an upward swing.
 This is not surprising in light of the continuing low inventory levels.
 Fewer choices generally mean higher prices.
- There has been no significant change in how long a property stays on the market.

All things considered the local market is looking pretty good. The general market supports continued confidence. The economy is gaining strength, the consumer is spending and taking on debt, living costs are holding steady, the job market is looking better, the retirement population is getting larger and Zillow and other forecasters are seeing growth. Congratulations to the Bailey-Matthews National Shell Museum. They celebrated their 20th


