THE MARKET STILL LOOKS GOOD!

The real estate market on these paradise islands continues to show their bright colors for the first quarter of the year 2018. Unit sales are on the plus side and the prospects for further growth are also on the plus side. Single family homes and condominiums are both showing healthy gains. Building lots are down considerably although that is not disturbing since there is so little land to sell. We have appended the details

Here is a quick summary:

- Single family homes are up 11%. Higher priced homes fronting on the water were up 15% while homes without direct access to water were even with last year.
- · Condominium sales were up 7%. The one and two bedroom units were even with last year and the higher priced three bedroom units were up 25%.
- · Building lots were way down after a strong finish last year.
- The average selling price reversed the recent declines and were up over 20%. This was due more to the sales profile than a true price increase – the water-front homes and larger three bedroom condominiums were a bigger share of sales this year than last year.
- The time it took to sell a property also reversed recent declines for homes. It took a bit longer to sell a home although this could be due to the profile. Condominiums continued to show a decline in selling time.

· New listings of all properties increased 5% over last year. They increased 11% for condominiums. That is really good news. Although it's only one report period it gives hope that maybe the inventory segment of the market can be stabilized and improved. It could impact the market pricing and selling time.

This is a nice picture of the island real estate market. It is likely due, in part at least, to a strong and growing economy and a record high equity market. But there is still some uncertainty.

How will the new tariff legislation affect the economy? Will a mortgage rate increase cool the market? Will foreign buyers find new outlets?

These are risks. But for the first quarter, at least, things look good. The real estate market, which came under the new tax legislation in the first quarter, didn't overreact, explode or die as some predicted. We will be watching to see if the new caps seem to have an impact. Some say it's going to keep potential sellers in their homes but we don't think so here. We don't prognosticate but we do think that our favorite islands are not subject to the same ground rules as the general market. The buyer of island property is less affected by the general market constraints. And they are motivated by a different set of values. Most important, they have David Schuldenfrei, the island pro. The volunteers drove 34,000 miles delivering neighbors to medical appointments and supplying food and medical supplies. More than 760 families visited the Food Pantry. GOODBYE PLASTIC

There have been two recent actions taken that are aimed at reducing the amount of plastic dumped on the beaches and byways of the

island. The targets are plastic straws and single use plastic water bottles. There are 500 million plastic straws that are discarded daily in the country and untold numbers of plastic water bottles. Coastal Keepers of the Sanibel Sea School is the author of the Strawless on Sanibel initiative www.sancapcoastal-keepers.org. The "Ding' Darling National Wildlife Refuge has stopped the sale of plastic single-use water bottles in its Nature Store replacing them with biodegradable and reusable water bottles. www.fws.gov/refuge/jn_ding_darling/.
